OPAL Update

Last Friday saw us introduce, in our first play assembly, the first stage of OPAL to the children. We introduced the 'Small World' play zone and to say it was a hit, might be an understatement! The children came up with wonderful suggestions and ideas around how we can ensure that we play respectfully and with integrity. They showed a sense of aspiration around wanting to make sure that playtimes were successful.





We had children from across the school play with building blocks, large vehicles, the farm yard and dominoes – to name just a few. It has been wonderful to stand back and watch children, who in the past may not have had much to do at lunchtime, other than run around, actively involved in play. After their first OPAL Small World playtime, some children were heard saying that it had been the best playtime ever!

We're happy with the introduction of the Small World Zone so far, which does include more frequent use of the Trim Trail, however, we are learning every day about how we can support the children with their play.

Ultimately we are aiming to get to a stage where the Small World Zone is comprised of a range of different play toys for every day to ensure that children remain engaged and looking forward to their next successful playtime. As such, we are still in need of toys!
